## SYNOPSIS:

The classic tale from 19th century literature by Charles Dickens is brought to life in this 3D adaptation that closely follows the original story. Seven Christmases after the death of his partner Jacob Marley, Ebenezer Scrooge, the miserable money lender spends the day complaining about the festive joy in the city, scaring his receptionist Bob Cratchit and rejecting the invitation of his nephew Fred to Christmas dinner. That night, Scrooge is visited by the ghost of Marley, who tells him that three spirits will appear, to offer him a last chance to change his life before it is too late. Scrooge is then summoned by the Ghosts of Christmas Past, Present and Future, each of which gives the old man a vision of different moments of his life, as well as visions of the life of the poor - but happy - Cratchit, whose his disabled, although happy son Tiny Tim is ill but is still full of the fun of the occasion.
